God is our Sun. He created the Sun, the Moon, the Stars and the Planets in part to illustrate His spiritual truths, so we could better understand our relationship with Him and how necessary He is to our spiritual solar system. Life itself would not be possible without the Sun. Without the light of the Sun we would be in total darkness except for starlight, just as without the Lord we would be in almost total spiritual darkness. Loving greetings to you in the name of our Lord and Savior. Thank you for finding time to write to your foster child each time you receive her letter. It encourages her to know that you are praying regularly with real care and concern.

As we look back on the year past we can't but praise the Lord for the wonderful things He has done. It is such a privilege to be a channel for His love and a joining link between "those who have" and those who have not", our underprivileged and not caring children. Each year brings us unprecedented things and some of you might have gone things very difficult and distressing

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time, but I am very sure you proved our Lord to be sufficient in each situation even everyone of us have. It is never easy to walk in the dark with little or no light, but thank God for His word which is full of encouragement and challenging whatever our situation is.

<u>Home - Admission of new children</u>: There was heavy demand for admission in our Home in June 2019. We came to know a large number of children are in need of care and protection who enter the Juvenile Justice system. But we were not able to take them because of the newly legislation of the Government since 3 years. We were greatly distressed about his condition. All the admissions for the children had to be done by the <u>President</u> together with the <u>Chairperson</u> and their Child Welfare Committees (CWCs) for admission in the residential homes for her long-term care, treatment, education, training etc. Only after receiving the <u>Order of Restoration / Replacement from the above Authorities with a Number for the Admission, a child could be admitted in any institution.</u>

At the time of the interview a child has to produce the following documents:

- a) Birth Certificate
- b) Income certificate
- c) Residential Certificate
- d) School/Transfer Certificate
- e) Aadhar Card
- f) Parents Aadhar Card
- g) Bank Book
- h) Family Card
- i) Voters list
- j) If both the parents are alive, a certificate from the Village Administrative Officer, saying about their family condition, and the need to admit the student in the home.
- k) if the father or mother is no more his/her death certificate.

There is a Management Committee consisting the following members:

- b) Superintendent of the Home (The Manager)
- c) 2 children representing different age groups
- d) Chairperson or member of the Juvenile Justice Board
- e) One representative from each local shelter
- f) Child line representative
- g) Vocational Training Institute representative, one member from a local body (Music/handwork)
- h) One Doctor from the Government Hospital/Primary Health Centre (PHC)
- i) Chairperson or member of the Child Welfare Committee (CWC)
- j) A Counselor/Psychologist
- k) Headmaster or Headmistress of Higher Secondary School
- I) Headmistress of Primary School
- m) Sub-Inspector of Police

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The new school year has started on the 3rd of June 2019 after being on long summer holidays because of the early school closing due to the Parliament Election (Central Government). After being at home for long summer holidays, when the children returned to the Frolich Home, one could observe the children with malnutrition with all the side effects. They were attended to immediately. Special diet was given to them. Those with lice, scabies and boils had been treated separately.

Still today, some school going children or drop outs are bearing the burden of earnings for a living to support their families. They have-not known the joys of the childhood as they have been working to earn a living. Most of them are forced to work so that the parents could repay the loan they had raised from their employers. Their life is of great struggle against heavy odds which has in it no place for color creativity for sports and games, dancing, drawing, and painting, singing and laughing etc. Our Home is in search of such kind of children for admission beyond difference of caste, creed and religious and wants to provide them a new life whose parents are working in hazardous unit. The children have to come across problems in regard to their studies due to family environment. Most of the parents are eking out a living as daily wage manual workers in the fields or mills and or brick-kiln etc.

A Home should be a loving Home for every child who should grow up in a family environment, in an atmosphere of happiness, love and understanding.

Activities: Besides the school program, the children are taught and encouraged to develop a variety of other skills-singing, drawing, painting and staging dramas, mending their own cloth, hand work, brooms making out of the fallen coconut leaves which are used for sweeping and cleaning the campus, garden work and beautifying the garden, keeping the environment neat and clean, pickles making, self cooking on leave days, enjoy the rights as citizens, to live in an environmental with friendly atmosphere with peace and harmony, offering the children the opportunities for developing their skills and to lead them to have self-sustainable life, mould them to become self-confident, promote group activities, assign specific responsibility of solving problems, love for animals and nature, encourage children to accept failures and challenges, accept the children as they are, create friendship relaxed and non competitive atmosphere enabling children to develop leadership qualities, sick room duties, helping the other children in their daily activities, if needed and many hobbies and extra curriculum activates as per their talents. In this way we are here to serve the children and to improve their qualities in all possible ways.,

But the main thing is that there was not so much time left over for the children to perform all these activities which they like to do and are interested to do due to the very limited time they have in the home. Most of the day time they were only are in the school.

Our home is being a "LIGHT HOUSE" of Godliness and sound knowledge among the so many villages in and around Pandur. In all the Church Activities, such as Sunday School, Junior

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Ministry Work, Youth church activities, All Night Prayer, Harvest Festival and other festivals like Vacation Bible School/Summer Bible School, Martin Luther's one week celebration with varieties program every day in the evening hour our children were the foremost to be in the church and participated in all the church activities and got prizes as well as in all competitions held in the church. The children have their own different personalities, temperament, interest, strength as well as weakness.

INDIVIDUAL CARE PLAN(ICP) -

- Individual care plan(ICP) means a comprehensive development plan for a child based on age specific and gender specific need and the case history of the child, prepared in consultation with the child, in order to restore the child's self-esteem, dignity and self-worth and nurture hit into a responsible citizen and accordingly the plan shall address the following, including but not limited to the needs of a child, namely.
- Health needs, including any special needs,
- Emotional and psychological needs,
- Educational and training ends,
- Leisure, creativity and play,
- Protection from all kinds of abuse, neglect and maltreatment,
- Restoration and follow up,
- Social mainstreaming

In June we have to renew the following certificates from the concerned officers.

- Land document and blue print of the building if it is functioning in a own building
- Certificate of building Structural Soundness (Stability Certificate) from Chartered Engineer.
- Building License Certificate from Tahsildar concerned No Objection certificate from the Fire & Recues Service Department
- Sanitary Certificate from the Health Office

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SCHOOL:

Our TELC Kabis Higher Secondary School is a co-education school where boys and girls are studying in the same school together. The best thing about co-education is that boys and girls are taught together without any discrimination. In small villages where there is only one school, co-education is the only choice. Even most schools in the city are now open to co-education. The reason for the advantageous of co-education is because of co-education is economical. There is no need to have a separate school for boys and girls. Secondly the understanding between boys and girls develops. Third, the two of them get to complete with each other whether in studies, games or debates. Co-education develops healthy competition among boys and girls and this brings out the best in children.

Co-education also has its drawbacks. Some people feel that co-education is against our tradition. They say the friendship in a classroom may lead to unwanted complications. They are also worried about disciplinary problems. But such instances are few and far.

The following Special Days were celebrated in the school:

Annual School Function: It is the most partied event in the school where everyone participates with keen enthusiasm. Students, teachers, parents and other guest facilities are invited and make the event very goal-oriented. On this day students perform and participate in activities, receive awards, the teachers and the head of the school announces annual report, performance of the students, share some lighter moments and there is more. Cultural Festivals: Schools in India also help to keep the social threads intact in the children and their parents. The cultural diversity is one of the most noted aspects of Indian society. To increase the awareness and help children better assimilate these traits many cultural events are hosted by the schools.

<u>Exhibitions</u>: Exhibitions are strictly organized to give the student exposure and appreciation for their faculties. Arts and painting exhibitions are the most celebrated occasions. The school management makes all arrangements. Such school celebrations in India are meant to encourage the children and bring out the talent hidden in them.

<u>Picnics and Excursions:</u> Picnics and excursion trips arranged by the school are also very entertaining for the students. It gives them opportunities to initiate social interactions and group formation. It's a pure outing and students are very much excited to spend time out of the campus.

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<u>Students Exchange Programme:</u> Students exchange programs are meant to share learning experience among the students who come from different institutions. Student's visits are organized to selected educational institutions and accordingly tours are conducted. Now-a-days modern schools in India have increased the number of such tours.

<u>Teachers-Parents Meet:-</u> -This event is the single most illustrious event that establishes a relationship between the educators and the parents. In the normal working days, schools normally do not encourage for frequent parent-teacher meets. It is on this day that the teachers can enquire about the children and the teachers provide the feedback about the children for the sound developments of the students. Apart from this day, Christmas Celebration, Road Safety/Awareness, Plastic Material Use–Eradication, Republic and Independence Days, Children Day and Annual Dayhad been celebrated. are .

Frolich Home: - All the days are special days in our Home. But this year we celebrated in addition to the special day , the Annual Nutritious Day on 18.09.2019. Ladies from the Child Welfare Committee demonstrated classes on Nutritious and gave all the children some nutritious snacks.

Pongal Festival: - On Sunday, 12.01.2020 from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm. Pongal Celebration took place with the 2 Government staff from Tiruvallur with a group of its Association. Many from local participated. Many know only the name of "Pongal" but do not actually know for what purpose it is celebrated so enthusiastically all over Tamilnadu. Just back from Christmas vacation, it's time for another set of holidays. Pongal is known by different names across India. This Pongal Festival is meant a great deal to the farmers . This is the time for the farmers across India to offer thanks for a good harvest. Most of us buy groceries from supermarkets so we don't worry too much about the weather. But we think of those whose livelihood are dependent on the vagaries of nature. Very often we know how farmers in India face problems like draught and flooding. We are happy to join the farmers as they celebrate a good harvest. The name Pongal denotes "boiling over" or overflow. Pongal is also the name of a sweetened dish of rice boiled in milk and jaggery that is ritually consumed on this day.

Pongal is celebrated for 4 days on the different names.

01) Pongal - harvest festival of South India

02) Bhogi - people discard old belongings and celebrate new possession.

O3) Maattu - refers to "cow, bullock and cattle. Hindus regard cattle as sources of wealth for providing dairy products, fertilizer, transportation and agriculture aid

O4) Kaanum - means to "to visit. Many families hold reunions on this day.

Pongal Communities organize social events to strengthen mutual bonds"

The reason for selecting the Frolich Home:

The Children in TELC Hostel (Both Boys and Girls) are from different community, different religion and from different Socio – economic status. So, it may be the chance for them to learn about our tradition and Tamil culture through such event. So the Management has decided to

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celebrate this program with the help of Event organizers called **Happy Activities** Company, who are specialized in incorporating traditional events to the children.

The Event Organizers had planned for the program in a more traditional way. They have conducted more than 20 traditional games and events and the children participated in all events without any hesitation. In fact they happily enjoyed this event. In the fast moving westernized culture with high fat foods like pizza and buggers, our home children had a chance to explore the taste of traditional foods and snacks. The Organizers have motivated the children by providing gifts and medals.

The Home Management Committee: Had to be conducted by the Manager 2 times in the year. Accordingly, she invited all the Committee Members (refer page 2 a—m) and all came and gave their valuable suggestions for the better implement of the home. Some suggestions could be accepted by the Management. 1) one instance - the parents are not permitted to go directly to the school to meet their children without the permission of the Manager of the Hostel which disturbs the school in between the class time.2) When the children come to the home after their holidays, the Management has to make a list of belongings a child brings and make another list of belongings when she leaves for holidays.

<u>Children Committee</u> -There is a Committee formed by the children in 5 age groups: 1) 1 to 6th std, 2) 7th to 8th std, 3) 9th std, 4) 10th and 5) 11th and 12th std. This committee discussed about their experience of daily life in the hostel and in the school, their want and dislike and what they wanted to have from the hostel and school – like self cooking, time for playing, extra hours for self study, more time for gardening, and television.

<u>Yoga Classes</u>:- were conducted for 10th to 12th standard girls and boys every Sunday from 5 to 6 in the Manager house. The meaning of Yoga was explained by the Yoga Master and his wife. The girls gave good response, but the boys not much. They did not like to sit steadily in the same place for one hour.

<u>Sunday School</u>: All the other classes were in Sunday School from 2.00pm to 4.00pm on every Sunday and some were in the Junior Ministry Work/classes. On every Saturday, our girls- one group cleaned the Dispensary despise it is not used and the other classes swept /broomed the church campus and cleaned the alter and the church inside thoroughly, using medical aids. The sitting mats were also washed with medical equipment. The brass vessels and the cross were polished by the cleaning material. On Sundays and on special days, flowers were arranged by the Manager in the altar. Of course, the church sexton and the Parish Helper were also helping the children.

School Partnership and Skype Talk:

Sadly these two programs were not functioning 2 to 3 years. because of the many changes in the GAT School (Gymnasium am Thiel), Blankenburg. But the TELC Kabis High School, Pandur and the Homes are still interested in these two projects.

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<u>Medical Aid</u>: A team of Doctors and Nurses came from the Government Public Health Centre for checking the children with height and weight despite our Home did the same every month. All the children got necessary medicines prescribed by the various special Doctors. The medical check-up took place in our Multipurpose Hall. Health programs were conducted now and then by the Nurses from the local Public Health Centre. also demonstration classes on the awareness program was given by the staff from the Government Hospital. Thanks to the foster parents, well-wishers and sponsors for their spontaneous support to donate money to build the M.P.Hall which are in many ways very useful.

On one free Saturday some girls went by van to the nearby V.G.R.Hospital for the dental checkup and were provided necessary treatment. On another free Saturday, a Free Dental Camp had been conducted by the same Priyadarshini Dental College and Hospital. Lunch was provided for the girls by the hospital staff. They all came happily by the Hospital van.

<u>Food:</u>- Children were provided sufficient and balanced food with leafy green vegetables. We had our own kitchen garden from where we got green leaves, herbs, few vegetables, bananas etc. Undernourished children got malnutrition, vitamins, egg, and milk in addition to the daily sufficient and balanced food. Special cases were referred to the Government and or Private hospitals for further treatment and investigation. Few children got spectacles.

<u>The Aim and Objectives</u>: -The vision is to make the poor – richer by not only providing food and shelter, but also by leading them into a holistic all-round development, a life of self-worth and self-sustainability with an aim to live not only for ones own self, but for helping others too.

<u>Visitors:</u> From abroad, from the Church and other Christian and Non-Christian Organizations from Tamilnadu and from the Government we had frequent visitors. Some were on surprise visits. The officers from the Child Welfare Committee, the District Child Protection Officers, Health Officers and so on visited very often our Home, verified the records and also gave few instructions. Among them were 1)to have some more bathrooms (3 numbers with doors) for the grown up girls (2) a new drying yard with a cement flooring to hang up the washed cloth were erected. The home did and, therefore, the expenses came to Rs.1,48,150.00. The Government never paid any amount for all their demands, all had to be spent by our foster parents' and well-wishers' donation. We had to take a photo and had sent these two new buildings to the concerned officers.

The <u>"HIGH LIGHT"</u> always was the visit of our dear foster parents' visit with our Project coordinator Winni – called by our girls "Winni Uncle". Those days of their visit was immensely joyful days for us all. With the support of him and our foster parents today our Roll-

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If I add all the left girls who completed the training and also some discontinued girls who left the project due to marriage, the total number would come up to nearly 200.

In memory of the 15 year completion of Amy Project- a visit to Germany was arranged last year in August by our Amy Project coordinator which my companion and I thoroughly enjoyed by seeing so many foster parents, well wishers, friends and Mission -partners. Our stay in our Project coordinator house with good food and rest gave us both a new life - filled with strength in our mind, soul and body. All the arrangements were systematically done so that we both could enjoy our stay to the uttermost over beyond our expectation.

<u>Covid-19</u>: We are very sad about the epidemics/pandemics - Covid-19 – a major health problem the world faces today. In Tamilnadu all the schools, hostels, colleges and universities etc. were closed from the 24th of March. All the hostel and school-college students had to leave to their native places. There were many times the change of curfew dates which were extended from the original announced dates. This is the 4th time the new order for the curfew.
